



We promote, finance, and support housing solutions for the people of NH.

- Financed 1,646 units of multifamily rental housing in FY24
- Monitored operations of thousands of rental housing units financed by NH Housing
- Administered federally funded rental assistance for 15,000 households statewide
- Helped 1081 families purchase a home in FY24



Why We Are Here Today

New Hampshire's in Need of Affordable Housing

- In 2024, the avg price of a single-family home topped \$500,000
- Rents continue to increase
 - Statewide Gross Median rent is \$1,833 for a 2-bedroom unit
 - Only 13% are affordable to the median renter household.
- Demand for action is strong:
 - 36% of UNH Granite State Poll respondents identified housing costs as the state's biggest issue
 - 75% of voters agree that more housing is needed in their communities (St. Anselm Survey)
- Based on estimated population growth:
 - Almost 60,000 new units between 2020 and 2030
 - Nearly 90,000 new units between 2020 and 2040
 - To meet production needs, we need to increase permits by 36% over recent levels





- Fisto began a search for a home after his rental home was put up for sale
- Worked with NH Housing and received 1stGenHomeNH grant and downpayment assistance to afford his new home in Penacook
- Has taken his experience as a means to educate members of his community on available homeownership options

- Took advantage of HOMEteam's financial workshops and counseling

FROM VOUCHER HOLDER TO HOMEOWNER


- Tori a social worker and mother of four support NH residents facing house insecurity
- A rental voucher holder herself, she transitioned to a Housing Choice Voucher
- With the voucher she was able to purchase a home better suited for her growing family





MULTIFAMILY HOUSING DIVISION

We finance construction, acquisition and preservation of affordable rental housing for families, individuals of all ages, and people who need supportive housing services (substance use disorders, veterans, transitional)







INVESTNH FUNDING FOR HOP GRANT PROGRAM

- The InvestNH Municipal Planning & Zoning Grant
 Program provides grants for cities and towns to create local regulations that will help increase housing supply, especially for affordable and workforce housing.
- In spring 2024, an additional \$2.9 million was allocated to the Housing Opportunity Planning (HOP) Grant Program
- To date, 58 municipalities have been awarded grants to hire consultants, study zoning and other regulations, and to update or make recommendations

NH SOLAR FOR ALL PROGRAM

- \$43.5 million awarded by U.S. EPA to develop solar power projects that benefit low-income households
- NH Housing, as grant co-applicant; will receive about
 \$24 million from NH Department of Energy to be expended over a five-year period
- Program will finance solar arrays at affordable multifamily properties, as well as community solar farms to reduce electric bills at designated housing communities

2024-2025 STATE LEGISLATIVE ACTIVITY FORECAST

- Last session: lots of activity, disappointing results
- Biennial Budget this session; funding for the Affordable Housing Fund is critical
- Work to strengthen existing programs to help municipalities
- Regulatory reform could expand property rights concerning:
 - Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs)
 - Recovery houses
 - Excessive lot-size requirements

Key to 2025: Working together on impactful and achievable goals
